Dear Uncle and all!

I take the feather in hand a letter to communicate to you. Share with you, that we are here all quite healthy and lively, and hope the same also from you. It makes us happy, which we can speak soon verbally with you. On the 30 day of the month already from Ströhen, we travel and on 2 June we board the steamer Sydlitz. Our crates are already sent, we have three crates, therein packed, one buffet and 1 wardrobe, the same are already by the customs officer checked. Hereby will I close in hope for a glad reunion.
